## *Memories*

Surveying the ideals and accomplishments of our first "Christian Camp Week" we look back with happy memories and thank God in the name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. The week spent at camp certainly far surpassed our fondest expectations--even as it is written of the blessings in Christ - "Eye has not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love Him."

Let us then, review and relive for a few moments, these blessed memories. Our thoughts carry us back to early Sunday, August 24th, in Tremont as we awakened early and began with eager anticipation to prepare for church. Our hosts are hurrying about to prepare things for the overflow crowd of brothers, sisters and friends from coast to coast who are rapidly assembling and it is here that we get our first foretaste of the love and fellowship that we are to experience more and more as the week progresses. In harmony of the Spirit we sing the welcome hymn, "We Now Greet You Brothers, Sisters" and our hearts are touched by the messages of salvation brought in the morning and afternoon services.

Early in the afternoon we all leave Tremont for the camp site, located some 50 miles distant, and on our way we experience the blessing of a cooling shower. Upon our arrival at East Bay Camp at Lake Bloomington we are delighted to meet a number of our brethren who drove directly there from distant points. Hearty and joyful greetings are exchanged as we grasp the outstretched hands of those who have come from afar to share God's blessings in true brotherly love. We find that things are being handled quite systematically and we soon locate our predetermined cabins where we become acquainted with those who are to share our cabin facilities. At this point we are again tremendously impressed by the fellowship and love shown by everyone -- a feeling which not only exists, but grows continually throughout the week.

We are soon finished with supper -- the first of the delicious meals we are to be served at camp, and then the inaugural camp meeting is held in which a hearty welcome is extended and several responses are given by brothers expressing their joy to have been able to come. After the greeting hymn is sung we hear a message from the Word of God and after the meeting we again visit with new found acquaintances.

Monday morning finds some of us arising early with a glorious sunrise, and going out to enjoy the picturesque scenery which surrounds the quiet lake. Others are awakened suddenly to sweet music wafting in through our cabins as a large group of enthusiastic campers have already crowded around a piano in the auditorium joyfully singing praises to God. Activity is everywhere and large groups are hurrying here and there when suddenly the beautiful, clear notes of the bugle indicate scheduled rising time!!!

Soon we gather for devotions where we implore God's blessings in prayer. Monday is a big day -- much time is spent acquainting ourselves with the layout of the camp and the plans for the week -- the question and suggestion box is introduced and we learn what a "trotter" is and how efficiently each "trotter" aids in the serving of our daily food in the dining hall and also learn that working together "one for all and all for one" is really great joy. Our lesson Monday morning is on confidence -- on extending love and understanding and on winning and keeping confidence. God blessed the message and the love that accompanied it so that our hearts flow together in trust and understanding all thru that wonderful week.

Tuesday and Wednesday pass swiftly. The ground is dusty and the air is hot and humid at East Bay during the "Dog days" of latter August but we hardly seem to notice as we hurry from place to place -- trying our best to miss nothing. In the forenoons we have precious lessons pointing to our Lord's coming again. At





one meeting questions from the question box are answered. Tuesday evening we have many visitors from Peoria and Tremont and after group singing, Brother Henry Michel gives a history of God's church thru the ages and relates the unselfish work of Brother Samuel Heinrich Froehlich and other brothers in past generations beginning about 1830 and their sacrifices made in order to bring the Gospel to others. We are moved by their noble example and by the blessings that God gave for the saving of souls. After this we have singing around a camp fire, which becomes a regular part of the evening activities for the rest of the week. On Wednesday evening the entire group proceeds to Inspiration Point, a high scenic point of natural beauty overlooking the lake and here we again hear from God's word and enjoy group singing.

Thursday and Friday also come and go rapidly. Thursday evening is spent in wonderment as we see God's handiwork in the form of pictures of beautiful Switzerland and of our own America and we feel anew God's infinite wisdom and power. On Friday evening a hastily assembled choir of sixty enthusiastic singers renders several hymns, and we are impressed by the results obtained thru the fine cooperation and unity that prevailed. Then, after a Gospel word some of the entries offered for 'camp names, camp mottos and "What I Liked Best About Camp" are read and prizes are awarded. A campfire watermelon party concludes another day of our swiftly passing week.



And now as Saturday morning arrives we realize that soon we must bid farewell to the fine friends from Syracuse or Minneapolis or Akron or Mansfield, or Portland or Union City, or Phoenix or Detroit, etc. We are suddenly surprised to hear someone remark "We haven't seen a newspaper or heard a radio for over a week." We have been completely separated from the world and its cares and we joyfully realize that we have never missed it, for we have been sharing a fellowship in Christ so manifold and so wonderful that we cannot adequately describe it. Saturday morning we have a closing meeting in which brother after brother brings a brief farewell message, each speaking from a heart that has been deeply moved by the experiences and God-given blessings of the week. Saturday afternoon we depart from our beloved Camp and go to Peoria where we are guests at a huge picnic.

Sunday, August 31st is a memorable one. Some 300 assemble in the Peoria church for Bible Class and morning services. Lunch is served at church at noon, and in the afternoon we meet at the home of a brother for an informal discussion of the Bible. Returning to church we are served supper, and then meet for a farewell service that deeply moves us. It is a sad, yet joyous farewell -- we have just finished a week such as we have never experienced before -- a foretaste of heaven and of the joys with Christ in eternity. And so, with some regret we depart for our respective homes with the sincere hope that God willing, we may live to enjoy another such a week next year.

PEORIA & TREMONT





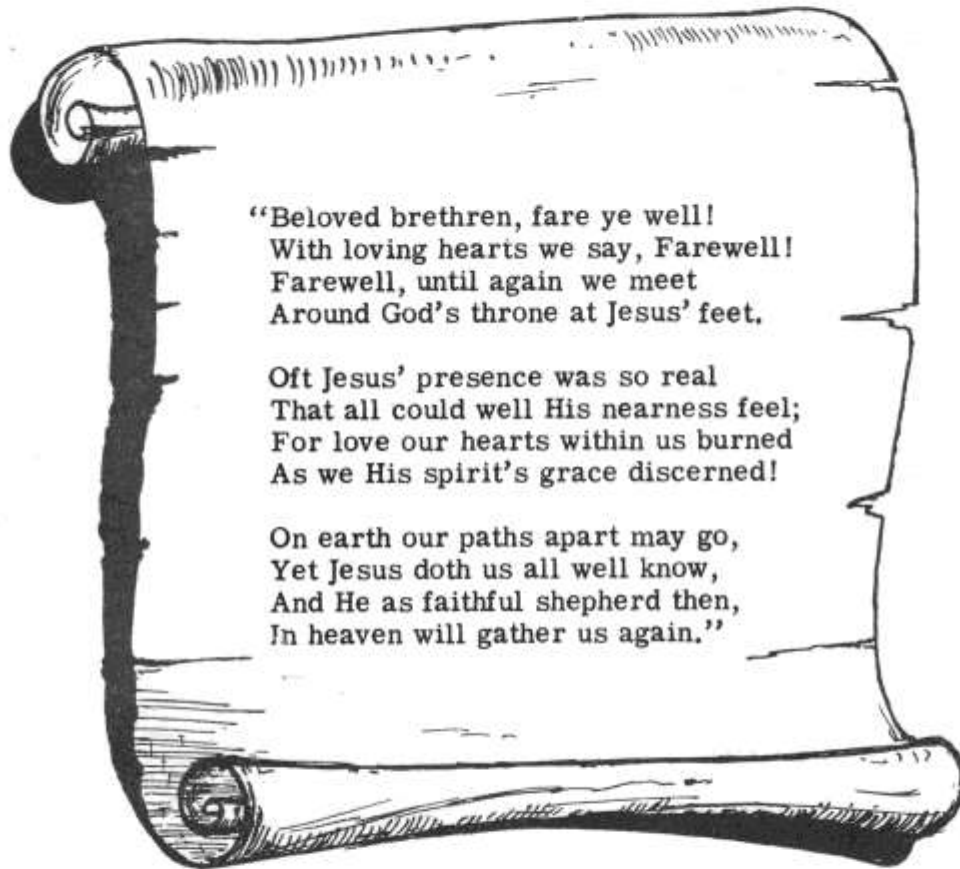
